
Visiting Macculloch Hall Historical Museum

There are sinks where I can wash my hands.


When I go into the galleries, I will remember to follow these rules:

I can go up the stairs to see bedrooms that are also over 200 years old.




If I am comfortable, I can go down the stairs to visit the kitchen.
